MS 69: Desht Collection

About the collection:

Martin Desht is a documentary photographer based in Santa Fe, New Mexico. Specialising in post-industrial urban landscapes his work has been exhibited at Harvard University, NYU, and Dartmouth College among other places. In 2006 he was the photographer in residence at Queen's University Belfast where he conducted a teaching photography project which documented the city of Belfast from a social/post-industrial point of view. This grew into an exhibition: "*A Certain Peace: Acceptance and Defiance in Northern Ireland.*" This collection, kindly donated to Special Collections, Queen's University Belfast by Mr Desht, contains the original negatives from this project as well as prints and other items such as the artist's personal notebook from the period.

Desht obtained release permission forms signed by the subject who appear in his photographs. The release forms that pertain to the photographs held in this collection are stored in our administrative files and not available for public consultation.
